But she even can't tell the candidates' names. Then one more worker joined our

conversation. She said they didn't care who would win in the election, provided that what

they do won't affect their benefit. Then we left the restaurant and continued to stroll around the district.

- We do not count the exact number of the posters, because there are so many within the constituency. (But at least over 40 posters for each candidate).
- Comparatively speaking, the number of posters of the two candidates is more or less the same.
- Banners are usually hung along the fence of roads, while posters are being posted at the front door of stores.

- The two candidates' posters are posted evenly distributed. Most stores have 1 poster for each candidate, like the restaurant we visited. When we walked passed 2-3 stores, 1 set of posters appeared.
- Just when we walked around the market, there's a promotion car of the Democratic Party parking nearby. It a small van, but with a large poster showing all their members, including 黎國雄, involved in the Central district. We noticed that many people, even the elderly, are attracted by it. But we can't see any candidates or members of the party over there. Maybe they have gone to visit the owners of the market.
- Some posters are damaged. Most of them are 陳耀強's

• On the way back to the university, we observed an obvious decrease in promotion in the western st while most posters and banners are hung up in centre st. we guess this is because there is a market and more stores near Centre st.

Conclusions drawn from your observation

- As both candidates 黎國雄 (Democratic) and 陳耀強 (DBA) in the constituency have political background, the competition is rather vigorous. This can be reflected by the no. of posters and banners.
- 西營盤 is a rather old district. Most of the stores are selling 海味 or some old-fashioned stuff, or it is a 茶餐廳. Residents of that constituency are mainly middle-aged with low income. Most of them simply don't care about the election.

- For the damage of posters, why does it happen mostly for the chan's ? Is it because of the party (DAB) he belongs?
- Are there any effect if the posters include some famous political figures?
