Candidates:

No.1 candidate: 歐立成:

“The election is not so competitive “; “I am a Wan Fu resident!!”; “The resident here will support “independence” rather than the one having party background.”

“I will think more about the interest of resident of Wan Fu and the local community here”

No. 2 Candidate 先偉材:

“The election is viable “; “The residents here show support to our party, also am I.”; “I am not resident here, but I serve here for many years.”; “ I am part of my party, I can voice out our residents’ opinion to my party, reflect to the government. And that’s the right way to improve the community here.”

Residents:

“I see Mr. Sin everyday morning” “Mr. Au looks an honest people”

“Mr. Sin isn’t living here, right?” “Mr. Sin had sent some leaflet to my family but Mr. AU seems not.

Leaflet:

No 1: His leaflets obvious focus on improvement the life in the local community. Most of the contents focus on the improvement of some facilities, lower the bus fee and something like that.

No 2: His leaflets seem better-designed and better-organized than No 1. For example, there are two type of leaflets for different people, youngsters and old people with different design and wording. For the youngster one, he “sells” more his party backgrounds with some conceptual wording; while, he emphasize the improvement of community for old people.

Conclusions drawn from your observation

Mr. Au has a better foundation in Wan Fu Estate. However, Mr. Sin has a better campaign strategy. About the party's background, there is no obvious advantage. Some people support Democratic Party, some ain't. As the sampling is too small, no conclusion can be drawn in terms of party advantage here.
