Despite last time's failure, we still hoping to meet the candidates or discover some election activities. We also hope to collect so leaflets, in order to provide information for our further research.

But unfortunately, after an hour of wandering, we still cannot discover any signs of election activities. Same as last time, there are still more property agencies. We have asked a security guard if she has seen some election activities nearby, but the answer is negative. Being frustrated, we decided to go to the other constituency, Charming, which is extremely close to our research target. (Actually the polling station of our target constituency is located in Charming, with unknown reason) We discover a community center which looks like pro-DAB. After reaching it, we found the candidate of Charming – Chung Kong Mo, and we have a chat with him.

According to Chung, there is no door-to-door visit in Fu Pak, due to the restriction of management agencies of the estates. The election campaign mainly focus on leaflets delivering, which is usually carried out at around 7am and 5pm, as the electors rush to work or go back home. At 7pm (which is the time we visit the site), most activities have ended.

After having a Chat with Chung, we continue our tour, which aimed at collecting the contact number of the candidates. This is done through finding the number at the poster and banners.

Conclusions drawn from your observation

We have finally discovered the election campaign schedule of the candidates, and have their contact number. We plan to phone them and try to obtain the exact plan for their campaigns.
