Because there was not much people on the street, we failed to do interview from the passer by, and we left at 3:45 pm.

At Broadcast Street, there were altogether 10 banners, 5 from candidate No.1 and 5 from candidate No.2.

I have interviewed a student, and a pair of couples. They told me that they have not registered as electors, as they cannot recognize the councilors, and they did not thick that the councilors cannot really help them.
