The Center for Deliberative Democracy at Stanford University and the Public Opinion Programme at the University of Hong Kong invite you to take part in *part two* of the *Workshop on Deliberative Democracy, Public Consultation and the Media*. This workshop will be **one of a kind** as part of the workshop will include an actual Deliberative Poll with a scientific, representative, and random sample of Macao citizens. On December 4, 2011, you will receive a special observer pass to witness the *first* Deliberative Poll in Macao, where citizens of Macao will discuss the press and audio-visual broadcasting laws. This Deliberative Poll is supported by the Macao SAR Government and by e-Research Solutions (Macao), in partnership with Hong Kong Baptist University, Lisbon University Institute, and the Center for Deliberative Democracy at Stanford University.

The last time we met we discussed how the public's voice is represented around the world and in particular, in the greater China region. We closely examined Deliberative Polling as a method of public consultation and dialogued about how deliberative methods, like Deliberative Polling, could be used to overcome the great challenges that our current society faces. This time, instead of just lectures and discussions, you have the opportunity to see for yourself how citizens engage in deliberation and how Deliberative Polling actually works.

This four-day workshop on deliberative democracy, public consultation, and the media will begin on Friday, December 2 with a working dinner beginning at 7pm. On Saturday, December 3, the morning will be dedicated to the method of Deliberative Polling, how results of Deliberative Polling are gathered and analyzed and in the afternoon, you will join the training of the *actual* moderators of the Macao DP. Sunday, December 4 will be the one-day deliberation for the Macao citizens and this one-day event will *also* include a parallel Deliberative Poll for media professionals. This workshop continues through to Monday morning (December 5) as the organizers of the Deliberative Poll will join the workshop, along with distinguished guests from around the world who have conducted Deliberative Polls. This Monday morning panel will discuss not only what happened in Macao, but will compare the Macao experience to experiences from Japan, Brazil, US, and other countries.
