Before the debate, around $\mathbf{5 0 \%}$ participants said citizens should support the political reform, while $\mathbf{2 5 \%}$ thought the opposite.
After the debate, around $39 \%$ participants said citizens should support the political reform, while $42 \%$ thought the opposite.
Further analysis shows that, among the 83 participants, opinions of 47 of them did not change, while 32 of them inclined to negative

Further analysis shows that, among the 85 participants, opinions of 53 of them did not change, while 20 of them inclined to positive.

Before the debate, $\mathbf{4 0 \%}$ participants hoped to have universal suffrage for the Chief Executive in 2012, while $44 \%$ said 2017.
After the debate, $44 \%$ participants hoped to have universal suffrage for the Chief Executive in 2012, while $47 \%$ said 2017.
Further analysis shows that, among the $\mathbf{8 3}$ participants, opinions of $\mathbf{7 0}$ of them did not change, while $\mathbf{1 0}$ of them moved their ideal year of universal suffrage for Chief Executive later.

Before the debate, $\mathbf{4 4 \%}$ participants hoped to have universal suffrage for the Legislative Council in 2012, while $29 \%$ said 2016.
After the debate, $\mathbf{4 6 \%}$ participants hoped to have universal suffrage for the Legislative Council in 2012, while $30 \%$ said 2016.
Further analysis shows that, among the $\mathbf{8 6}$ participants, opinions of $\mathbf{7 3}$ of them did not change, while $\mathbf{9}$ of them moved their ideal year of universal suffrage for Legislative Council later.

Before the debate, around $\mathbf{5 4 \%}$ participants thought the Government has not been fighting hard for democracy for Hong Kong citizens, while $\mathbf{1 4 \%}$ thought the opposite. After the debate, around $\mathbf{5 3 \%}$ participants thought the Government has not been fighting hard for democracy for Hong Kong citizens, while $\mathbf{1 6 \%}$ thought the opposite.
Further analysis shows that, among the 87 participants, opinions of 57 of them did not change, while 15 inclined to positive and 15 inclined to negative.

Before the debate, those who thought it was important if it is defined by the United Nations, the Legislative Council, the HKSAR Government and the Central Government accounted to $\mathbf{6 1 \%}, \mathbf{6 0 \%}$, $\mathbf{5 7 \%}$ and $\mathbf{4 0 \%}$ respectively.
After the debate, the priority of importance became, the Legislative Council, the United Nations, the HKSAR Government and the Central Government, with respective percentages of $\mathbf{7 1 \%}$, $\mathbf{6 5 \%}, \mathbf{5 0 \%}$ and $\mathbf{4 3 \%}$.
